

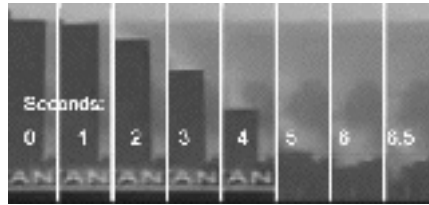
# 7 problems with building 7

7 -- No mention in the NIST Building 7 Final Report of this mysterious steel specimen.

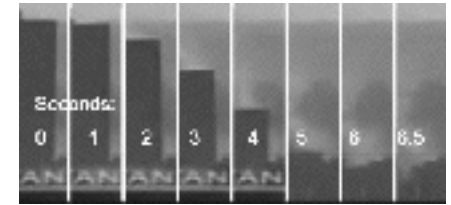

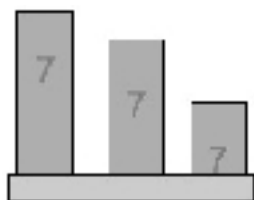
Composite time photo of Building 7 freefall.

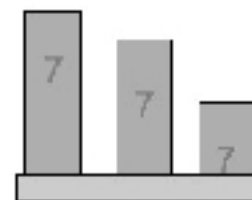
